## TESTING FOR GMO CONTAMINATION

Kwiaht can now test for the presence of GMOs in the following crops: squash, carnations, bent grass, papaya, plum and wheat as well as some of the modifications in beet, canola, corn, cotton, potato, rice, soy, and tomato.

Samples can consist of seed, leaf tissue, food or feed.

Testing is free, but participation in lab work and a donation of \$7.00/sample for supplies is encourage.

Testing is for your information and cannot be used for GMO-Free certification.
